The registration deadline for the next ACT (April 14th) is March 9th. Go to www.actstudent.org. ****Note:** Every SAT and ACT has a *Late registration date* for which there is an additional charge.

It's not too late for seniors to apply for Financial Aid. Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov. Financial aid may be used at universities, community colleges, and technical school. Be sure to go to the official site where applying for financial aid is FREE. If there is a charge, you are on the wrong website!
